SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Baptism is celebrated after consultation with the parish staff as to date. Registered membership in the parish and attendance at a Baptism Class are required for all parents prior to their first child's Baptism.

Holy Communion

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the first grade. It culminates in the celebration of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the second grade.

Confirmation

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the sixth/seventh grade. It culminates in the celebration of Confirmation.

Matrimony

A six-month required sacramental preparation process begins when the engaged couple meets with the priest or deacon and culminates in the couple's exchange of consent on their wedding day.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

A one-year process for preparation and study is required for all those interested in becoming Catholic.

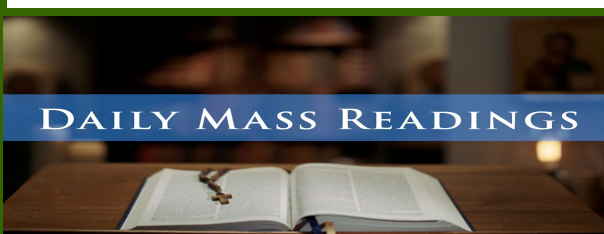

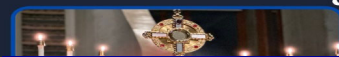

January 7*

ALFRED BESSETTE WAS BORN TO A POOR FAMILY OUTSIDE OF MONTREAL IN 1845. HE WAS SO SICKLY WHEN HE WAS BORN THAT HIS PARENTS BAPTIZED HIM RIGHT AWAY.

I baptize you in the name of the Father...

WHEN ALFRED WAS 9 HIS FATHER DIED IN A LOGGING ACCIDENT. HIS MOTHER DIED 3 YEARS LATER.

Now I won't be able to go to school. I guess I need to find a job.

ALFRED WAS ALWAYS SICKLY. AFTER TRYING MANY JOBS HE BECAME A RELIGIOUS AND TOOK THE NAME ANDRÉ.

BECAUSE HE WASN'T EDUCATED, HIS JOB WAS ANSWERING THE COLLEGE DOOR.

BR. ANDRÉ HAD GREAT DEVOTION TO SAINT JOSEPH. MANY PEOPLE WERE CURED BY HIS PRAYERS.

THOUSANDS CAME TO TALK TO HIM. HE WAS VERY KIND TO THEM ALL. HE WOULD ALSO GO TO VISIT THE SICK.

Here's a St. Joseph medal!

BR. ANDRÉ GOT PERMISSION TO HAVE A CHAPEL, THE ORATORY OF ST. JOSEPH, BUILT ON THE HILL IN MONTREAL. HE DIED BEFORE IT WAS FINISHED, AT AGE 92.

SAINT ANDRÉ WAS A SIMPLE MAN WHO COULD HARDLY EVEN WRITE HIS OWN NAME. BUT HIS DEVOTION TO SAINT JOSEPH AND LOVE FOR THE PEOPLE MADE EVERYONE LOVE AND TRUST HIM. WE CAN LEARN FROM HIS EXAMPLE THAT WE CAN HAVE GREAT CONFIDENCE IN THE SAINTS, ESPECIALLY ST. JOSEPH!

Saint Paul the First Hermit

January 15

SAINT PAUL THE HERMIT WAS BORN IN THE 200'S IN EGYPT. HIS PARENTS DIED WHEN HE WAS YOUNG. WHEN A PERSECUTION BEGAN, HE HID IN A NEIGHBOUR'S HOUSE.

Can you hide me from the soldiers?

BUT HE WAS AFRAID THAT HE WOULD BE FOUND, SO HE RAN AWAY TO THE DESERT.

THERE HE HID IN A CAVE, INTENDING TO RETURN HOME WHEN THE PERSECUTION WAS OVER. I wonder how long it will last.

HOWEVER, HE LOVED THE QUIET SO MUCH THAT HE DECIDED TO STAY IN THE DESERT!

SAINT PAUL GOT WATER FROM A SPRING AND FOOD FROM A TREE NEARBY. I could even make clothes from the leaves!

HE PRAYED AND LIVED A HOLY LIFE IN THE DESERT, BUT WAS TEMPTED TO THINK THAT HE WAS GREAT BECAUSE HE WAS THE FIRST HERMIT. Maybe I am the greatest hermit... NO! I must not be proud!

HOWEVER, HE SOON MET SAINT ANTHONY OF THE DESERT, WHOM HE REALIZED WAS HOLIER THAN HIMSELF. PAUL LIVED UNTIL HE WAS 113 YEARS OLD!

How our parish already practices this goal:

- ◆ Twice a year, Service Committee has a food drive with all donated food products given to the Christian Life Center. Children collect cans of food each week
- ◆ We financially support charity programs through the Diocesan 2nd collections
- ◆ We participate in Rice Bowl Program every year
- ◆ Special Events Committee hosts a back-to-school drive and/or a winter clothing drive each year and given to Family resource Center of Mercer County School
- ◆ Service Committee sets up a Christmas Giving Tree with donations used to purchase gifts to the shut-ins of the parish and residents of the local nursing home and Thompson-Hood Veterans Center in Wilmore, KY.
- ◆ Any food left over from events is packaged up and donated to the Mercer Transformation who feed the homeless in the community daily
- ◆ We are part of the Mercer County Resource Ministry that provides funds to help individuals that do not qualify for other sources of assistance. Our parish volunteer interviews those seeking assistance. We contribute to this group on a quarterly basis. We also keep funds to help any of our members that need assistance.

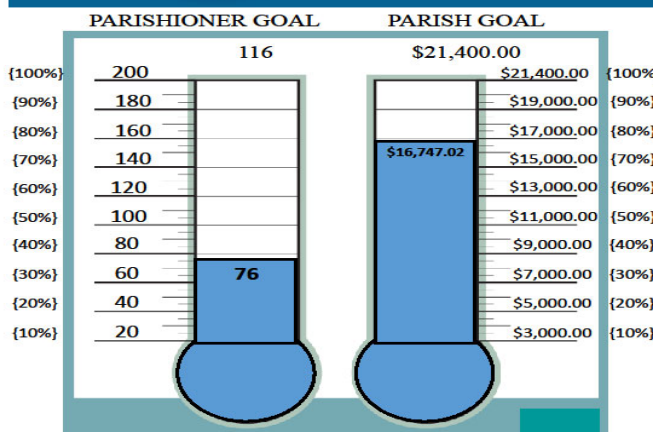

MASS ETIQUETTE

APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR DURING MASS

- 1. FAST.** Do not eat any food for one hour before mass starts. Drinking water is allowed.
- 2. COME EARLY.** Allow for 10-15 minutes of meditation before Mass
- 3. DRESS PROPERLY.** Show decency in God's house
- 4. USE HOLY WATER.** Bless yourself in the sign of the cross, as a sign of your baptism, as you enter and leave the church
- 5. DO NOT EAT, CHEW, OR DRINK.** The church is a place of prayer and reflection
- 6. NO PHONES.** Silence or turn off your mobile phones
- 7. GENUFLECT.** Kneel towards the tabernacle before sitting
- 8. BE SILENT.** Avoid talking and take loud children to an appropriate place
- 9. LET OTHERS SIT.** Allow others to sit in your pew
- 10. PARTICIPATE.** Sing, respond, listen, and pray
- 11. BE CONSIDERATE.** Respect personal spaces
- 12. STAY UNTIL MASS ENDS.** Leave after the priest leaves
