SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Baptism is celebrated after consultation with the parish staff as to date. Registered membership in the parish and attendance at a Baptism Class are required for all parents prior to their first child's Baptism.

Holy Communion

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the first grade. It culminates in the celebration of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in the second grade.

Confirmation

A two-year required sacramental preparation process begins in the sixth/seventh grade. It culminates in the celebration of Confirmation.

Matrimony

A six-month required sacramental preparation process begins when the engaged couple meets with the priest or deacon and culminates in the couple's exchange of consent on their wedding day.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

A one-year process for preparation and study is required for all those interested in becoming Catholic.

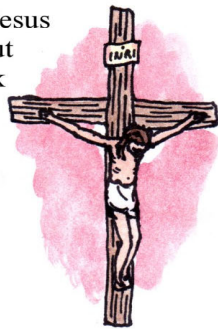
Looking at Jesus

SAINT CYRIL OF JERUSALEM MARCH 18

SAINT CYRIL WAS BORN IN JERUSALEM AROUND THE YEAR 315. HE WAS RAISED A CHRISTIAN AND WELL EDUCATED. HE BECAME A DEACON AND THEN A PRIEST.

HE WAS ORDAINED BISHOP OF JERUSALEM, BUT A HERETIC BISHOP NEARBY REFUSED TO ACCEPT HIM. "I am in charge of Jerusalem too!"

CYRIL ARGUED AGAINST THE ARIAN HERESY BUT HE DID NOT UNDERSTAND THE TRINITY HIMSELF EITHER. "I know that Jesus was alive even before he became Man."

Yes, Jesus and the Father are consubstantial. EVENTUALLY HE DID AGREE WITH THE CHURCH TEACHING AT A COUNCIL.

SAINT CYRIL TAUGHT THE FAITH TO THE NEW CHRISTIANS. WE STILL HAVE SOME OF HIS TEACHINGS. "Do not think it mere bread and wine."

MEANWHILE, HE WAS SENT INTO EXILE THREE TIMES BY THE HERETICS AND THE EMPEROR. "He sold church furniture to help the poor!" "Send him away!"

FINALLY HE CAME BACK AND FOUND JERUSALEM IN A SAD STATE OF SIN AND CORRUPTION. HE WORKED THERE UNTIL HE DIED AROUND THE AGE OF 70.

AT FIRST CYRIL DIDN'T HAVE A VERY GOOD UNDERSTANDING OF THE HOLY TRINITY, BUT HE KNEW THAT THE ARIANS WERE WRONG. THEY SAID JESUS WAS LESS IMPORTANT THAN GOD THE FATHER. CYRIL TAUGHT WHAT HE KNEW WAS RIGHT ANYWAY. DO YOU TELL OTHERS WHAT YOU KNOW ABOUT GOD?

MASS ETIQUETTE

APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR DURING MASS

- 1. FAST.** Do not eat any food for one hour before mass starts. Drinking water is allowed.
- 2. COME EARLY.** Allow for 10-15 minutes of meditation before Mass
- 3. DRESS PROPERLY.** Show decency in God's house
- 4. USE HOLY WATER.** Bless yourself in the sign of the cross, as a sign of your baptism, as you enter and leave the church
- 5. DO NOT EAT, CHEW, OR DRINK.** The church is a place of prayer and reflection
- 6. NO PHONES.** Silence or turn off your mobile phones
- 7. GENUFLECT.** Kneel towards the tabernacle before sitting
- 8. BE SILENT.** Avoid talking and take loud children to an appropriate place
- 9. LET OTHERS SIT.** Allow others to sit in your pew
- 10. PARTICIPATE.** Sing, respond, listen, and pray
- 11. BE CONSIDERATE.** Respect personal spaces
- 12. STAY UNTIL MASS ENDS.** Leave after the priest leaves

Survey: More than one in three Americans hit by scams, fraud in past year


More than one in three U.S. adults (34%) have experienced financial fraud or a scam since January 2024, with nearly two in five (37%) out of that group losing money, according to a new survey by Bankrate.

According to the survey, most respondents who faced a scam over the past 12 months said someone accessed or attempted to access their personal financial information, such as their bank account, credit cards or Social Security number. More than half (57%) say those attempts were unsuccessful.

Baby boomers and Generation X were the most likely to experience financial scams, followed by Gen Z and millennials, according to Bankrate. However, half of Gen Z respondents who said they experienced a scam lost money, followed by 45% of millennials, 32% of Gen X and 26% of baby boomers. The survey also found that respondents earning less than \$50,000 a year were the most likely to have experienced fraud or a scam.
